What level student should take this test?

MAP Growth Reading 6+ is designed for students in 6th through 12th grade.

What is a computer-adaptive test?

This type of test adapts to a student's knowledge level based on their performance as they move through the test. The first question is based on either their registered grade level or their previous MAP performance.

How does a computer-adaptive test work?

The question difficulty adjusts up or down based on whether a student is answering questions correctly or incorrectly.

How long will it take to receive results?

1-2 days.

What is included in the score report?

Percentile

This compares the student's performance to the norm group showing how the student compares to their grade-age peers in the season that they tested in.

RIT Scores

For Reading 6+ and for the subtopics. This is used to track growth over time.

Learning Statements

Learning statements are typically 10-15 pages of specific skills the student is ready to learn.
